In consultation with the training team, additional people can also be nominated if they play an important role in the company in the event of an incident.

Ideally, a site-specific core team with different responsibilities and decision-making roles should take part.

Training Content:

During this **one-day training course**, relevant stakeholders and decision-makers in companies are prepared for **real hazardous situations at their business location** in a highly practice-oriented way. The offer complements existing prevention, safety and crisis management processes within the company.

The training includes a theoretical block providing up-to-date knowledge on **climate trends, extreme events and their frequency, corporate climate change adaptation, as well as crisis management and communication.**

The core of the practical block is a **discussion-based crisis exercise**. Participants deal with a natural hazard event involving several escalation stages, such as **flooding, heavy rainfall, log jams or the inundation of company premises.**

The scenario is **simulated realistically at Wassererlebnis Öblarn** and adapted to the key processes, roles and challenges of the respective company. A summary of the key learnings rounds off the day.
